SPEAKER BIOS

Emily Baker, PharmD, BCPS, MBA, MHA, NorthStar HealthCare Consulting

Dr. Baker is President and CEO of NorthStar HealthCare Consulting in Atlanta, Georgia, where she provides guidance to state Medicaid agencies, managed care plans, and commercial insurers on clinical programs and pharmacy audits.

Prior to starting her own company, Dr. Baker worked as an Assistant Director of HealthCare Information and Analytical Services at ACS State Health. Formerly Board Certified in Pharmacotherapy, Dr. Baker received her Doctorate of Pharmacy from the University of Georgia and completed a specialized residency in drug information at the Samford University Global Drug Information Center. Additionally, Dr. Baker has completed her Masters of Business Administration as well as her Masters of Healthcare Administration.

Specialties: Clinical utilization management and fraud and abuse for both government sponsored programs and commercial payers.

Antonio Ciaccia, Ohio Pharmacists Association, 46brooklyn Research

Born and raised in pharmacy, Antonio has been crawling around pharmacies his entire life. After three years as a pharmacy technician and two years of pre-pharmacy curriculum, Antonio diverted course, graduating from The Ohio State University in 2007 with dual degrees in communications and political science before moving into the world of association management. Thinking that pharmacy would be in his rear-view mirror forever, he ended up making his way back to his pharmacy home, heading up government affairs for the Ohio Pharmacists Association, a trade organization with a strong track record of advocating for drug pricing transparency. After years of studying the pharmacy marketplace, Antonio became increasingly perplexed and concerned as he saw drug costs spiking while payouts to pharmacies were declining. Knowing something was being lost somewhere in the middle of an ever-growing transaction, Antonio has spent years working to crack the drug pricing code and pull the rug out from what he believes is one of the most dysfunctional marketplaces in the world.

John M. Coster, PhD, RPh, Director, Division of Pharmacy, CMS

John M. Coster is the Director of the Division of Pharmacy, Center for Medicaid and CHIP Services, at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. He has served in this capacity at CMS since August 2014. Dr. Coster is responsible for policy and operational issues relating to the Medicaid pharmacy and prescription drug rebate program. Prior to joining CMS, he served in various senior government affairs positions in safety net hospital and pharmacy professional associations.

Dr. Coster holds a B.S. in Pharmacy from St. John's University, and a Masters and Ph.D. in Health Policy from the University of Maryland Graduate School. He completed an executive residency in association management at American Society of Health System Pharmacists (ASHP). He holds pharmacist licenses in New York, Maryland, and Virginia.

Sara Drake, RPh, MPh, MBA, Mercer Consulting

Sara Drake is a Principal in Mercer's Government Human Services Consulting practice. Her experiences across the pharmacy, government, and health care landscapes allow her to assist her clients in evaluation, research, analysis, and implementation of both new and existing policy options for managing Medicaid benefits in both the managed care and fee-for-service (FFS) environment.

Prior to joining Mercer, Sara worked for the Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) where she served in a dual role as the Deputy Director of Health Care Purchasing and Service Delivery and Pharmacy Program Manager. Prior to her role in state government, Sara's experiences included management consulting, nonprofit health plan, inpatient hospital pharmacy, and retail pharmacy.

Danna Droz, JD, RPh, Prescription Monitoring Program Liaison, NABP

Danna Droz is the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) Liaison for the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP). She works with all state PMPs to provide services to their stakeholders. Previously she served as the Director of the Ohio PMP (2005-2013) and the Kentucky PMP (1999- 2003). Ms. Droz graduated from the University of Kentucky, College of Pharmacy and the University of Louisville's Brandeis School of Law. She is a Registered Pharmacist in Kentucky and Ohio and admitted to the Kentucky and Ohio bars. Ms. Droz has served as the President, Chair and Member of the Executive Committee of the National Association of State Controlled Substance Authorities (1998-2013). In 2001, the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators (NADDI) named her Educator of the Year for her work with health care practitioners and law enforcement officers. NABP recognized her contributions in 2012 with the John F. Atkisson Service Award.

Fury Fecondo, PharmD, AmeriHealth Caritas Delaware

Fury Fecondo, PharmD is the Market Pharmacist at AmeriHealth Caritas Delaware. He serves on the state's Pharmaceuticals and Therapeutics Committee and the state's Drug Utilization Review Committee to provide clinical and financial insight on pharmacy decisions. Fecondo also oversees the Pharmacy Benefit Manager in implementing clinical policies and meeting financial goals. Many of the current policies being implemented center on the opiate epidemic and limiting opiate exposure, excessive quantities, and dangerous interactions around the products.

Fecondo's experience in the pharmacy field has been diverse. He began in retail pharmacy, moved into long-term care, and then worked in pharmacy benefit management at the state's fiscal agent. Fecondo has a Doctor of Pharmacy from Duquesne University, with a certification in health care management. He graduated in 2002 and was the Class President and commencement speaker. He has been part of the American Drug Utilization Review Society for the past 10 years, and has served as a program chairman and on their Board of Directors for the last three years.

Fecondo lives in Wilmington, Delaware. His hobbies include the local adult sports league and paddle boarding. He has volunteered with Habitat for Humanity and Big Brothers of Delaware.

Tom Frank, PharmD, BCPS, Frank Medical Consulting

Tom Frank has been involved in various aspects of drug therapy for over 35 years. He has worked in retail, hospital, nursing home, clinical and consultative pharmacy practice settings.

Dr. Frank has recently established Frank Medical Consulting, a business focused on continuing education presentations for a wide range of healthcare groups. He also provides consulting services on complex patient medication regimens.

Previously, he was an Associate Professor of Pharmacy Practice at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences- Northeast where he was the Director of Education and Research. He taught drug therapeutics to family medicine residents at the Northeast Arkansas Area Health Education Center in Jonesboro, Arkansas. Dr. Frank also provided clinical pharmacy consultation services and continues to serve on the Institutional Review Board (IRB) at St. Bernards Medical Center.

Maria Lowe, PharmD, BCPS, Institute for Clinical and Economic Review (ICER)

Maria joined ICER as the Director of Pharmaceutical Intelligence in May 2019. In this role, she is responsible for tracking developments in the drug pipeline to advise the ICER team on potential topics of interest.

Prior to joining the ICER team, Maria worked at the University of Massachusetts Medical School's Clinical Pharmacy Services as a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist responsible for the development and maintenance of a customized database for tracking pharmaceutical pipeline developments. In 2013, Maria joined the Health Data Integrity team at PatientsLikeMe – an online patient powered research network – as a Health Data and

Drug Information Specialist. Since 2009 she has been invited to serve as an annual guest speaker about drugs in development at a variety of local and national meetings.

Maria received her PharmD from Northeastern University, completed a two-year fellowship in health outcomes research and pharmacoeconomics, and is a board-certified pharmacotherapy specialist.

Jennifer Murray, PharmD, BCGP, Senior Manager, Myers and Stauffer LC

Jennifer Murray, PharmD, BCGP is a Senior Manager within Myers and Stauffer's Pharmacy Program Area with over 14 years of experience in pharmacy practice, including five years in Medicaid pharmacy rate setting and reimbursement.

Jennifer serves as a clinical and technical advisor for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) National Average Drug Acquisition Cost (NADAC) project. She consults on day-to-day NADAC operations and is involved in the quality assurance of the weekly NADAC publications and process improvement initiatives. She assists state Medicaid clients by providing management and oversight for a multitude of fiscal and data analyses to enhance understanding of acquisition cost-based reimbursement and pharmacy benefit management. She is involved in a number of analytical and clinical services surrounding evaluation and reimbursement recommendations for procedure coded drugs, 340B program evaluation, cost/benefit analyses of preferred drug list programs and beneficiary lock-in programs, specialty drugs, pharmacy claims analysis and cost containment opportunity evaluations.

Jennifer has clinical pharmacy experience in retail, long-term care, and specialty pharmacy. In this capacity he has consulted with several clients, including Myers and Stauffer, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), multiple state Medicaid programs, several research and consulting bureaus, SVC Inc, the Indiana Hemophilia and Thrombosis Center, pharmaceutical manufacturers and the Indiana Attorney General's Office Medicaid Fraud Control Unit. He also serves on the Board of Directors for 46brooklyn Research (www.46brooklyn.com), an IRS-recognized 501(c)(3) Public Charity dedicated to pharmaceutical pricing transparency and utilization of public data for the common good.

Mike has played a significant and ongoing role in the CMS National Average Drug Acquisition Cost (NADAC) project. He has been heavily involved in the design, development, implementation, maintenance, management and stakeholder communications since the inception of the NADAC initiative in 2011. In addition, he has provided consultation on the Federal Medicaid Rebate program generic CPI penalty resulting in annual savings of greater than \$450 million dollars.

Prior to his current position, Mike was the Director of Pharmacy for the State of Indiana Medicaid pharmacy program. In this capacity, he was responsible for all aspects of pharmacy benefit administration, including budgeting, staff supervision, legislative affairs, compliance with all state and federal laws and contractor performance related to drug rebates, clinical services, prior authorization, claims processing, reimbursement and implementation of new program initiatives. Mike represented Region V states on the CMS Pharmacy Technical Advisory Group.

Mike has significant experience in Medicaid pharmacy benefit management and has developed multiple innovative solutions for addressing program needs within the Medicaid pharmacy space. Areas of expertise include drug pricing, regulatory affairs, claims processing, pharmacy informatics, procedure coded drugs, drug rebates, expert testimony and both Medicaid and commercial pharmacy benefit management.
